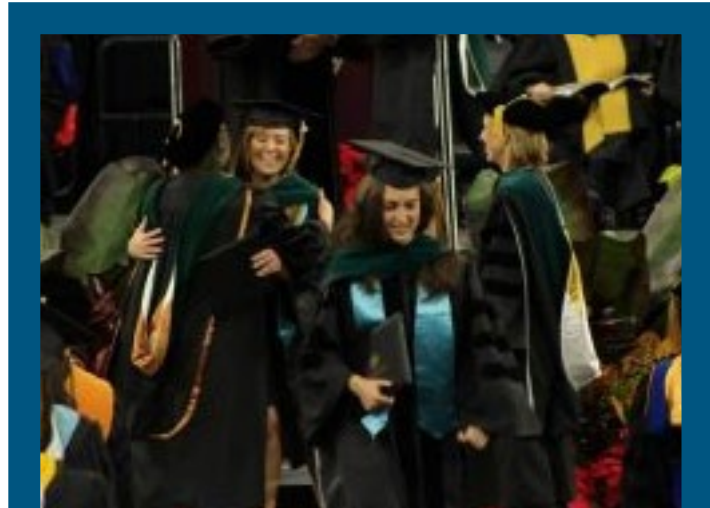
T.A.G. BEACH VOLLEYBALL
